

The regular meeting of the Clearfield County Commissioners was held on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 with Chair Sobel conducting the meeting. The following were in attendance: Commissioners Scotto and McCracken; Kim Kesner, Solicitor; Tom Adamson, Controller; Suella Himes, Dir Tammie Kyler and Ben Stone, Crossroads Project; Jeff Corcino, Progress/Courier; Jessica Shirey, gantdaily.com; Lisa McFadden, Chief Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting of September 25, 2018 were approved by motion of Commissioner McCracken, seconded by Commissioner Scotto; motion carried unanimously.

Controller Adamson presented the following bills for approval: General Fund, \$803,972.78; Liquid Fuels Fund, \$3,629.43; 911 Fund, \$638.30; Children Youth Services, \$52,131.12; Domestic Relations Fund. \$1,281.47. Chair Sobel welcomed Suella Himes, Tammie Kyler and Shawn Day who attended the meeting to ask the Board to Proclaim October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Ms. Himes gave the following statistics for 2017 in Pennsylvania there were 117 victims killed due domestic violence and of those two were in Clearfield County and so far one additional one death in 2018. Clearfield County Crossroads assisted 1295 victims and provided 3741 counseling hours; they sheltered 42 victims for 1127 nights. Ms. Kyler spoke of the Lethality Assessment program that they began in June 2017 where the police contact Crossroads and the victim speaks to a counselor advocate to find out what they can do to for the victim to make them safe at that moment currently 17 high danger 12 non-high danger and 19 victims seeking services. Currently Clearfield Borough, Curwensville Borough and the County Sheriff's office participate in the program. Motion to proclaim October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month by Commissioner Scotto, seconded by Commissioner McCracken; motion carried unanimously.

Consider reappointment of Shelia Williams to the Board of Directors of Clearfield County Housing Authority. Ms. Williams's term will be in effect from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023. Motion to approve the reappointment by Commissioner McCracken, seconded by Commissioner Scotto; motion carried unanimously.
