

The regular meeting of the Clearfield County Commissioners was held on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 with Chair Sobel conducting the meeting. Chair Sobel presented a Memorandum of Understanding with the Dubois Housing Authority for services with Children Youth Services. Solicitor Bozovich asked that the Board table the MOU as she had not had

a chance to review the document. Motion to table the matter by Commissioner Scotto, seconded by Commissioner Glass; motion carried unanimously.

Solicitors Report

Solicitor Bozovich updated that Board that she reviewed the Delegation Agreement with the Redevelopment Authority and the RDA Solicitor is currently reviewing the document.

Ms. Bozovich also advised that there are no new updates on the STEB agreement.

Commissioner Glass updated the group that the application for the Covid-19 Hospitality Industry Recovery Program (CHRIP) will be available on the County website on March 15, 2021.
